

2026 Washington Youth Tour Application

Next summer, a chosen group of our local students will have the chance to take part in an FREE trip to our nation's capital, courtesy of Salt River Electric, Kentucky Electric Cooperatives, and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association!

The 2026 Washington Youth Tour will take place June 15-20, 2026. The trip will be awarded to a select number of local high school juniors from Salt River Electric's service area.

Over the course of a week, these deserving students will visit with Kentucky's congressional delegation, see attractions such as the Smithsonian Institute, Arlington National Cemetery, Monticello, the U.S. Capitol, and learn more about the importance of electric co-ops.

Applications are being accepted now through **December 19, 2025**.

Requirements:

- 1. Applicant must be a current junior in high school.
- 2. An applicant's parent or guardian must be a member of and receive electric service at their main residence from Salt River Electric.
- 3. Applicant must also submit an unofficial copy of their most recent school transcript.
- 4. Letters of recommendation are not required, but may be submitted.
- 5. Applicants must successfully complete this initial application, in addition to writing a 500-word essay on a provided topic. If necessary, an initial round of selections will be made once the deadline has passed, with those applicants being contacted for an inperson interview.

Applicants for the Washington Youth Tour must complete a 500-word essay on one of the following prompts:

- Recall a time when you were in a leadership role, whether at school, a group, or in your community. How did you work to make a difference?
- Salt River Electric was founded to provide reliable electricity to rural communities. Explain how having reliable electricity affects your daily life, and how our lives would be changed without it?
- Member engagement is crucial for a cooperative. How do you believe electric co-ops can better engage with newer (and younger) generations of members?
